The Annual General Meeting is pre-advertised as required by the Association By-laws and is held in the spring (in March or April).

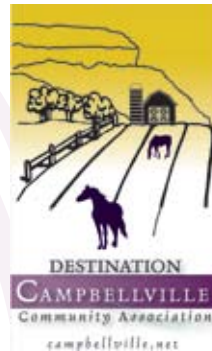
Members are notified of all general meeting dates by email at least 5 days in advance of a scheduled meeting.



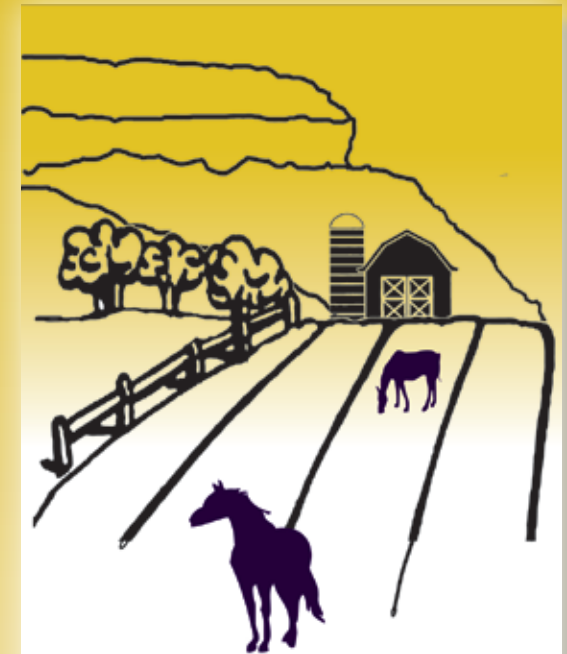

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# Destination Campbellville Community Association (DCCA)

## BACKGROUND

This Association was formed as a result of several community meetings held in late 2006. Support for some type of community-based organization was significant and quickly led to the formation of the Destination Campbellville Community Association (DCCA).

Income was determined to come from two sources: internal events organized and executed by the DCCA and through external fundraising from sponsors or donors.

In 2009, the DCCA became an Incorporated Non-Profit organization with by-laws that outline how the association is run.



## OBJECTIVES

The Association adopted three mandates:

- To improve the quality of life for those who live and work in the area.
- To increase tourism and visitors to Campbellville and the Nassagaweya area.
- To act as a liaison between Agricultural, Recreational, Residential, Commerce and Government interests with the intent to enrich the community through direct activity, cooperation and communication.

## STRUCTURE

The Board of Directors consists of 8 members each holding a Committee Chair position. This Board may select, appoint or elect an Executive consisting of a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer from within or external to the Board members. All Directors and the Executive must be prepared to commit time, skill and effort to their position.

Eight Committees were established to ensure the Association was organized to represent all segments of the community. Each Committee is directed by a Chair and Vice Chair, and individual members as volunteered from the general membership.

The Committees are comprised of:

- AGRICULTURE (including equine, farms, farm service businesses, flower growers) represents that sector.
- BEAUTIFICATION plans and manages activities and projects to enhance the attractiveness of the village.
- COMMERCE (non-agriculture businesses) represents the interests of non-agriculture businesses.
- EVENTS develops, organizes and executes member-generated events for either promotional or for fundraising purposes.
- FINANCE maintains financial integrity of the Association and supervises all monetary-related activities.
- MARKETING (including tourism) develops and executes marketing strategies and promotional-related activities including web site development and maintenance.
- MEMBERSHIP develops and maintains programs to solicit and retain members.
- PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT undertakes short- and long-term planning, liaises with Town, Region and Conservation authorities on planning issues.
